



Educational outcomes of BAUFM programme:

A. Patient & Population Care

- A-C1. Communicate effectively with patients and relatives.
- A-C2. Gather appropriate information about patients; for proper identification of their problems.
- A-C3. Decide about diagnostic and therapeutic interventions based on patient information and preferences, up-to-date scientific evidence, and clinical judgment.
- A-C4. Develop and carry out proper management plans, with the engagement of patients as partners.
- A-C5. Perform competently medical procedures essential for the management of common health problems.
- A-C6. Counsel and educate patients and their families.
- A-C7. Use information technology to support patient care decisions and provide patient education.
- A-C8. Provide health care services aimed at preventing health problems and maintaining health.
- A-C9. Work with health care professionals, to provide patient, family and community care.

B. Essential Medical Knowledge

- B-C1. Acquire a medical core of basic and clinical sciences, which are appropriate to the care of a patient and the community.
- B-C2. Demonstrate ability to reason and think analytically in approaching clinical situations and applying medical knowledge in patient problem solving.

C. Practice and Evidence - Based Learning

- C-C1. Make decisions based on evidence, when such is available, rather than opinion.
- C-C2. Locate, appraise, and assimilate scientific evidences related to their patients' health problems.

C-C5. Understand and apply information technologies in basic clinical and biomedical research.

D. Communication Skills

D-C1. Create and maintain effective, ethically sound, caring and respectful relationships with patients relatives.

D-C2. Work effectively with health care team, or other professional groups.

E. Ethics and Professionalism

E-C1. Demonstrate respect, compassion, and integrity; a responsiveness to the needs of patients and society that supersedes self-interest; accountability to patients, society, and the profession; and a commitment to excellence and on-going professional development.

E-C2. Demonstrate a commitment to ethical principles pertaining to provision or withholding of clinical care, confidentiality of patient information, informed consent, and business practices.

E-C3. Demonstrate sensitivity and responsiveness to patients' culture, age, gender, and disabilities.

F. Health Care System and Cost Effective Practice

F-C1. Assist patients in dealing with healthcare system and advocate for quality patient care.

F-C2. Practice cost-effective health care and resource allocation that does not compromise quality of care.

F-C3. Demonstrate understanding of the relation between patient care and health care organization with respect to the larger society.
